

**Teacher Guide Page** Christmas Photo Inference A

This activity uses Christmas-themed images to help students practice i inferences. Students will examine visual details such as facial expression language, objects, and Christmas elements to determine what is happ photo and how the characters might feel. Students then support each using evidence from the image.

#### Why This Activity?

Learning to infer is foundational to reading comprehension — and pic a low-barrier entry point. Students first analyze what they can see, the observations to deeper meaning. The winter theme adds a relatable engaging context that sparks curiosity and discussion.

#### 1. Introduce the Activity

- Explain that students will infer what is happening in each Chri
- Model how to cite visual evidence using sentence frames like

#### 2. Image Observation & Note-Taking

- Display the first image

#### 3. Inference + Evidence Practice

- Students work individually, in pairs, or small groups to answer:
- What is happening in the picture?
- How might the person/people feel? What specific clues support your ideas?

#### 4. Wrap-Up Writing / Discussion

- Share-out time for different inferences and evidence.
- Optional writing prompt: Write a caption or short paragraph the mood of the scene.

- They choose which book they would rather read.
- They write a short explanation for their choice, citing

#### something specific from the synopsis that appealed to them.

- If you have physical copies of the books, display classroom.
- Encourage students to check them or the activity
- Use this as a springboard into boo reading, or literature circles,


